VIRITS FASTES

A ndy Granatelli was one of the hot rod kings of the late 1940s before becoming a dominant force in Indy Car racing in the late '60s. Today head of the Tuneup Masters chain of auto shops, he's no stranger to automotive speed records. He and a team of drivers set 400 national and world speed records at the Bonneville Salt Flats and Daytona Beach between 1960 and 1963, most of which still stand despite several factory backed assaults.

Granatelli was at it once again recently when he set the fastest speed ever recorded for a passenger car, driving a stock bodied '82 Chevy Camaro to a speed of 184.238 mph though he hadn't sat in a race car for over 20 years. The run came in a sanctioned meet of the famed Southern California Timing Association on El Mirage Dry Lake in the California desert near Edwards Air Force Base where the Space Shuttle lands.

The ever "humble" big Andy played down the circumstances of the run, saying of his long absence from racing, "That's all right. It wasn't a race car anyway, it's my personal car! I drive it daily to work and back! The car is totally stock inside and out, it has power steering, power brakes, air conditioning, an automatic transmission, and even a telephone! I just wanted the world to know that you are never too old to do something you want to do," the now 60-

of the record. Granatelli's son V.J. put together a twin-turbocharged 350cid Chevy engine using off the shelf items available to the public. Regardless it still meets emission standards and drives normally, even in heavy stop and go traffic!

Granatelli amazingly added that the car still has plenty left! With veteran observers calling the surface and wind conditions the worst in years, though only having 1.3 miles of hard packed dirt on which to accelerate to the 132 foot long timing lane Granatelli kept his foot in it. "I wanted to see what she would do so I kept on accelerating past the timing lights," he said. "I got another 800 rpm which I means I hit a top speed of 211 miles an hour. The car had more left but it was getting close to where I had nowhere to go to get stopped!" He feels with proper room, like at Bonneville, he could hit 225 or 230!

If you'd like a duplicate, Granatelli estimates the car can be copied for about \$U\$25,000. Not bad for your basic go to work "street sleeper".
