Mothers Member Of the Month

Well Howdy, Sheriff Steve Graham coming at y'all, Blame Grant and Mothers for that.

I joined HBR around 2005 when the meetings were held at the Red Beach Surf Club, the club was a lot smaller then, I had earlier imported a Caddy and a Gen 5 El Camino and was at the Beach Hop, I saw Mike Dyer and Dave Brock lounging outside a bar wearing pretty cool jackets, asked some questions and hello there I was, a member.

I bought the Elky by mistake off the estate of the original owner, I was messing around on E-Bay, had just set up my PayPal account, and was absently bidding on cars to get a feel of things. The auction closed, I was underbidder, Phew, dodged a bullet there, and then, Hello, the top bidder welched and there I was, out \$ 2400.00 usd. It cost me a lot of money in the end but by the time it was finished she was a pretty cool car.

Dad taught me to drive in Mums 1956 Vauxhall Victor, up and down the drive and around the front and back yards, He bought me a 59 Ford Thames van that we refurbished and I continued bouncing it off apple trees for a while, I changed my 1st set of spark plugs about this time, Mums mini never ran the same after that. I got my licence 1st hit driving my mint 1964 Beetle, I was 15 years and 1 week old.

I went on to own heaps of standard and custom Beetles, even won some tinware at the 1983 Bug In at Meremere.

I have owned around 100 cars since then, including, but not in order, a 68 Cougar, couple of Valiant hardtops and then a couple of Dodge Darts, Capri's, E49 Charger, A9X Torana, GTR Torana, 2850 SL Torana, a 1966 5 Dial dash Porsche, Alfa Giulia GT, BMW 2500 Sedan, Mercedes SEL 450 Limo, a couple of GT Cortinas, a swag of jappas, and even a few Fords including a mint XD Sedan, EA Falcon 5 speed S pak, 68 Wagon, a Fiat 130, couple 132's blah blah. We currently have Debs Z28, an AMC Spirit and a 1970 Mk4 Zodiac. Bucket list cars would include a 1959 Elky, 1965 / 66 Charger.

My worst car was the big 450 SEL Merc, Hungry, Rusty, Smelly, Unreliable, much like me, 2nd worst was a Lada 2104 wagon, I got the piss taken big time, but all the boys at one time or another borrowed it when their flash cars pooped themselves. It had a disguise kit so no-one knew who was driving it. It was a large brown supermarket bag with eye, ear and mouth holes cut in it, so you could see, hear and still drink beer whilst hiding from the public.

I have built and raced offroaders, midget cars, Limited saloons and stock cars, even did pretty good in most of them, took quite a bit of hardware home to polish. I had a big hit in my stockcar at Wacky baccy Park one night, slammed into the wall coming off Cemetery Bend, steering broke, car turned right, max blat 3rd gear, tore the concrete to bits, sprayed dust over the audience, was out cold. Didn't lift off though apparently. She finally stalled out coming into town bend, still turning right. I came to in the meat wagon, my beautiful daughter was standing in the door way absolutely destroyed, she thought I was dead, I haven't raced since.

My best road trip was to Christchurch to run the Porsche engine in, all good. Coming home, I woke up asleep, sideways at warp speed in the ditch outside the Cambridge golf club, near pooped myself, I haven't slept so soundly since.

I kept my licence that time but have walked a few places a few times since as a result of excess terminal velocity or too much socializing.

I am a Marine Engineer by trade on both Steam and Motor ships and have spent many years at sea up and around Europe, the USA, Central and South America, the Caribbean, the Cook and Solomon Islands including Papua New Guinea and Australia.









Orewa Santa Parade
